DOMESTIC TRANSFER STUDENTS

Application Requirements

✓ **APPLICATION**

✓ **HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS**

Official transcripts for all four years of high school are required for applicants who have accrued less than 30 college-level credits since high school graduation.

✓ **TRANSCRIPTS FROM EACH
POST-SECONDARY INSTITUTION ATTENDED**

Transcripts from summer college programs are optional unless you received college credit for the coursework.

On your application, please **ONLY** include post-secondary institutions (colleges) you attended after graduating from high school.

✓ **LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION** (optional)

✓ **COLLEGE REPORT** (optional)

On the application, you may request this document from the registrar's office of your current institution.



INTERNATIONAL TRANSFER STUDENTS

Application Requirements

✓ **EVERYTHING LISTED TO THE LEFT**

If your transcripts are not in English, GW requires original transcripts and certified English translations.

✓ **FUNDING STATEMENT**

Available in your applicant portal.

✓ **DEMONSTRATED ENGLISH PROFICIENCY**

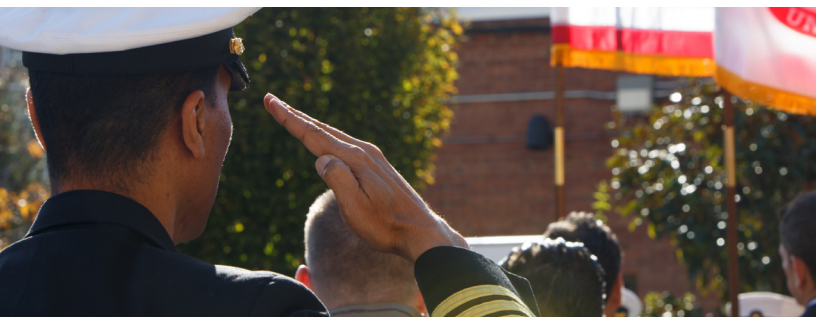

\$10,000 PER YEAR FOR TWO YEARS
- ▶ Transfer Engineering Scholarships
\$16,000-20,000 PER YEAR TO QUALIFIED APPLICANTS

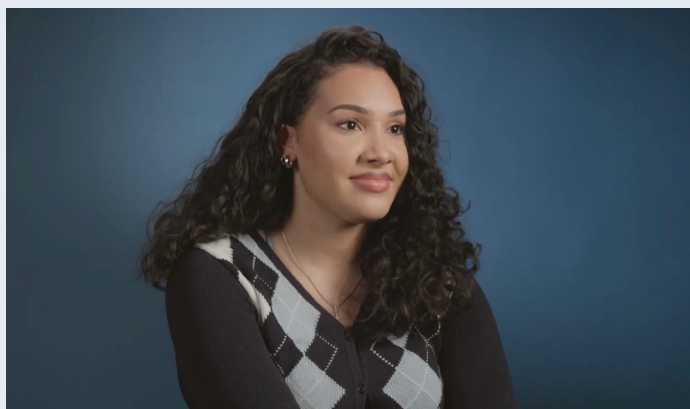
TRANSFER STUDENTS WHO LIVE ON CAMPUS ARE ELIGIBLE FOR GW'S REVOLUTIONARY PROMISE

- ▶ Applicants from families with a total household income of \$100,000 or less **can qualify for free tuition**
- ▶ Applicants from families with a total household income of \$100,001 to \$150,000 **can qualify for 50% off tuition**
