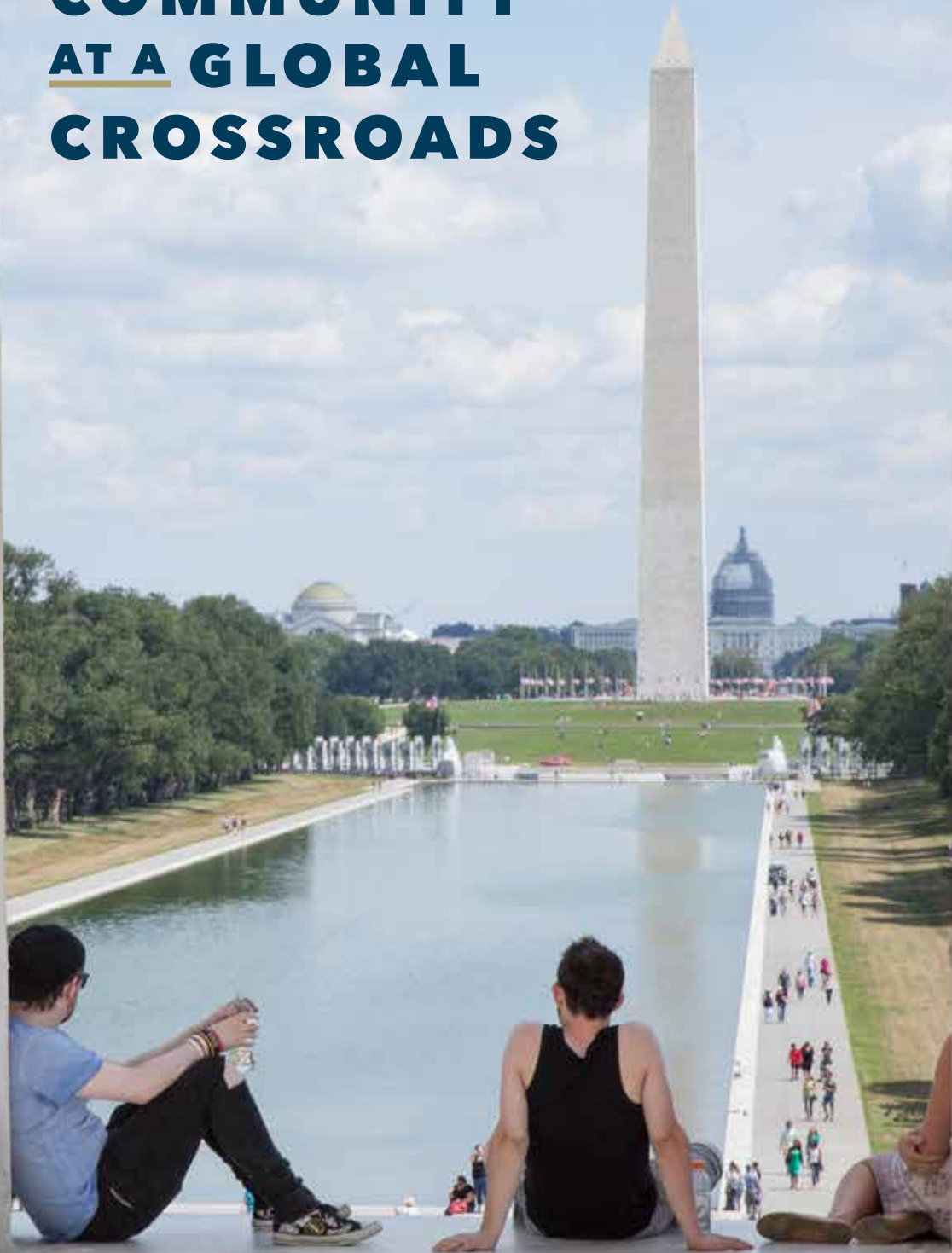

GW offers a Presidential International Scholarship, ranging from \$5,000 to \$25,000 per year for up to five years of undergraduate study to the most academically competitive international applicants. Students are automatically considered during the admissions process.

The #YouAreWelcomeHereScholarship program provides two selected international undergraduate students with a renewable scholarship that covers 50% of tuition at GW.
