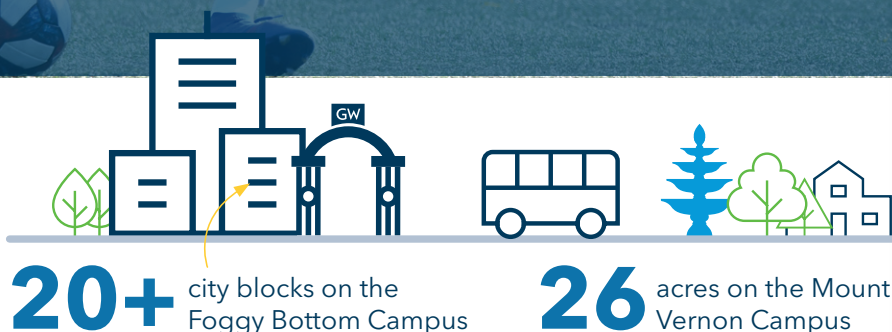
WHAT WE MAKE IS HISTORY.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

- ✓ Common Application
- ✓ Official School Transcripts
- ✓ Letters of Recommendation
- ✓ Demonstrate English language proficiency
- ✓ Financial Certificate
(on Common App Supplement)

To meet the English Language Proficiency requirements for admission, GW applicants should earn:

- ✓ A minimum score of 90 on the TOEFL; OR
- ✓ A minimum score of 6.5 on the IELTS; OR
- ✓ A minimum score of 61 on the PTE Academic; OR
- ✓ A minimum score of 115 on the Duolingo English Test

GW offers a Presidential International Scholarship, ranging from \$5,000 to \$25,000 per year for up to five years of undergraduate study to the most academically competitive international applicants. Students are automatically considered during the admissions process.
