- ✓ A minimum score of 115 on the Duolingo **English Test**
- Additional documents will be required for admitted students

Merit **Scholarships**



GW offers a Presidential International Scholarship, ranging from \$5,000 to \$25,000 per year for up to five



years of undergraduate study to the most academically competitive international applicants. Students are automatically considered during the admissions process.
